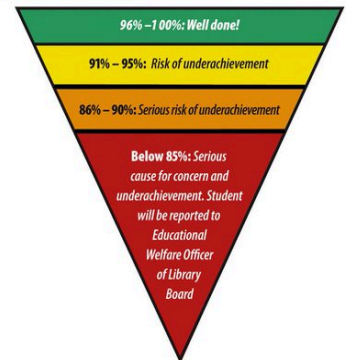
## EVERY SCHOOL DAY COUNTS

Every single day a child is absent from school equates to a day of lost learning.

Attendance percentages can be misleading.

Attendance	Days Missed	Category
100% Attendance	0 Days Missed	EXCELLENT
95% Attendance	9 Days of Absence	SATISFACTORY
90% Attendance	19 Days of Absence	POOR
85% Attendance	28 Days of Absence	UNACCEPTABLE
80% Attendance	38 Days of Absence	UNACCEPTABLE
75% Attendance	46 Days of Absence	UNACCEPTABLE

For some parents 90% may seem like an acceptable level of attendance, but the reality is that 90% attendance means that your child will miss half a school day each week or 19 days of school during the school year – that's nearly four school weeks.
