Welcome to the last week of the Autumn term with the Christmas holidays around the corner. Read on to find out what is in store for the last week of term.

Early Closure

The last day of term is Friday 20th December and we will be closing early. All children will need to be picked up by 1.30 pm and there will be no shine club after school provision on that day. Both nursery am and pm sessions will have a class party in the morning with all children in the nursery being picked up at 11.45 am. Full-time nursery children are welcome to stay for lunch and be collected at 1.30 pm alongside the rest of the school.

Attendance Star's Class

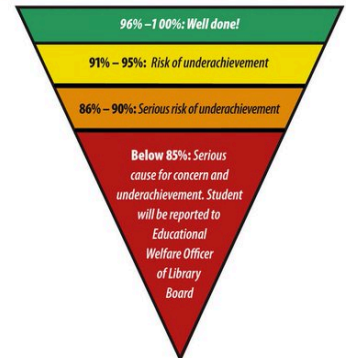
EVERY SCHOOL DAY COUNTS

Every single day a child is absent from school equates to a day of lost learning.

Attendance percentages can be misleading.

100% Attendance	0 Days Missed	EXCELLENT
95% Attendance	9 Days of Absence 1 Week and 4 Days of Learning Missed	SATISFACTORY
90% Attendance	19 Days of Absence 3 Weeks and 4 Days of Learning Missed	POOR
85% Attendance	28 Days of Absence 5 Weeks and 3 Days of Learning Missed	UNACCEPTABLE
80% Attendance	38 Days of Absence 7 Weeks and 3 Days of Learning Missed	UNACCEPTABLE
75% Attendance	46 Days of Absence 9 Weeks and 1 Day of Learning Missed	UNACCEPTABLE

For some parents 90% may seem like an acceptable level of attendance, but the reality is that 90% attendance means that your child will miss half a school day each week or 19 days of school during the school year – that's nearly four school weeks.



Remember to ensure your child is at school every day and that he/she is in school ready for our soft start from 8.50 am - 9.00 am at the latest. This is time for your child to review their work in books, respond to their teacher's marking and read and complete early work activities.

The class with the best attendance each week will get the star which will be displayed in the main school hall. The class with the most attendance stars at the end of the year will receive a surprise fun trip as a reward for excellent attendance.
