As a school, we are looking for ways to continue to ensure that Fullwood children are healthy children. To make sure this happens we want to ensure that they have as many opportunities for outdoor play throughout the day. Many of the children have expressed how much they love the outdoor games and activities, and we do not want to limit these opportunities due to muddy or wet conditions.

We are introducing a system where children in Years 3-6 have the opportunity to change into 'Lunchtime shoes' for outdoor activities so play can take place on the field in all weather conditions. 
### **EVERY SCHOOL DAY COUNTS**

Every single day a child is absent from school equates to a day of lost learning.

Attendance percentages can be misleading.

100% Attendance	O Days Missed	EXCELLENT	
95% Attendance	9 Days of Absence 1 Week and 4 Days of Learning Missed	SATISFACTORY	
90% Attendance	19 Days of Absence 3 Weeks and 4 Days of Learning Missed	POOR	
85% Attendance	28 Days of Absence 5 Weeks and 3 Days of Learning Missed	UNACCEPTABLE	
80% Attendance	38 Days of Absence 7 Weeks and 3 Days of Learning Missed	UNACCEPTABLE	
75% Attendance	46 Days of Absence 9 Weeks and 1 Day of Learning Missed	UNACCEPTABLE	

For some parents 90% may seem like an acceptable level of attendance, but the reality is that 90% attendance means that your child will miss half a school day each week or 19 days of school during the school year – that's nearly four school weeks.
