- *Parenting Choices and Decisions Workshop* - Having had several conversations with parents and carers in recent months with regards to challenges being faced with the behaviour of our children at home, Mrs Bateman will be hosting a workshop for parents on Friday 31st January from 9.15 to 10.30 am. This workshop will give you, as parents, the opportunity to listen to some suggestions and initiatives from teachers and school leaders which may support you in bringing up your little people. It will also be a forum where we can discuss issues and concerns that we have and share some ideas for managing defiant and inappropriate behaviour. This workshop will aim to discuss: the Maths National Curriculum (fluency, problem solving, reasoning), The CPA approach (concrete, pictorial, abstract), Core skills and requirements for outstanding mathematicians, Increase confidence and understanding in supporting your child at home with a view to SATs examinations.

Thank you for allowing your children to bring in their bikes, share their bikes and allow all children to learn this life skill. 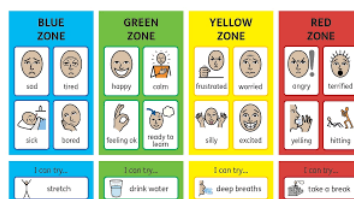


Please remember that **if the children do not have a helmet we will not allow them to ride** that day for safety.

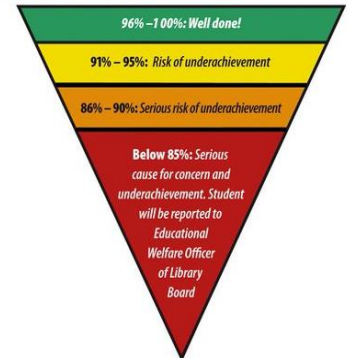
EVERY SCHOOL DAY COUNTS

Every single day a child is absent from school equates to a day of lost learning.

Attendance percentages can be misleading.

100% Attendance	0 Days Missed	EXCELLENT
95% Attendance	9 Days of Absence 1 Week and 4 Days of Learning Missed	SATISFACTORY
90% Attendance	19 Days of Absence 3 Weeks and 4 Days of Learning Missed	POOR
85% Attendance	28 Days of Absence 5 Weeks and 3 Days of Learning Missed	UNACCEPTABLE
80% Attendance	38 Days of Absence 7 Weeks and 3 Days of Learning Missed	UNACCEPTABLE
75% Attendance	46 Days of Absence 9 Weeks and 1 Day of Learning Missed	UNACCEPTABLE

For some parents 90% may seem like an acceptable level of attendance, but the reality is that 90% attendance means that your child will miss half a school day each week or 19 days of school during the school year – that's nearly four school weeks.
