School Enrichment: Workshops and Experiences

As a school we recognise the importance of your continued support in contributing to the funding of our school workshops. These workshops play a crucial role in enriching our students' educational experiences, offering hands-on learning opportunities that go beyond the traditional classroom setting.

These experiences come at a cost, and are calculated carefully by staff. We try not to overload parents with requests for money but have found recently that parents are choosing not to make contributions to these experiences, making it increasingly difficult to fund and provide these opportunities. We fully understand that there may be contributing factors as to why a payment might not be able to be made, but would ask that this is communicated to staff or at least a voluntary contribution is made, however small.

Your monetary contributions enable us to bring in expert facilitators and create an environment where students can actively engage in creative and practical learning. These workshops are designed to complement the core curriculum, allowing our students to explore new ideas, develop critical skills, and apply their knowledge in meaningful ways.

Some of our pupils took part in a BBC Live Lesson, exploring key digital safety topics. 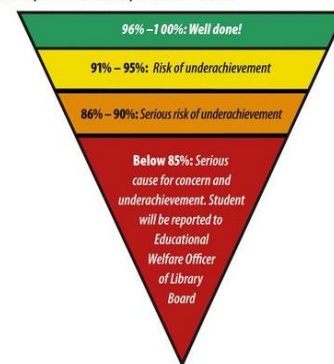
Well done to class 11 with over 97% attendance this week. **Our whole school target is 97%**

EVERY SCHOOL DAY COUNTS

Every single day a child is absent from school equates to a day of lost learning. Attendance percentages can be misleading.

100% Attendance	0 Days Missed	EXCELLENT
95% Attendance	9 Days of Absence 1 Week and 4 Days of Learning Missed	SATISFACTORY
90% Attendance	19 Days of Absence 3 Weeks and 4 Days of Learning Missed	POOR
85% Attendance	28 Days of Absence 5 Weeks and 3 Days of Learning Missed	UNACCEPTABLE
80% Attendance	38 Days of Absence 7 Weeks and 3 Days of Learning Missed	UNACCEPTABLE
75% Attendance	46 Days of Absence 9 Weeks and 1 Day of Learning Missed	UNACCEPTABLE

For some parents 90% may seem like an acceptable level of attendance, but the reality is that 90% attendance means that your child will miss half a school day each week or 19 days of school during the school year – that's nearly four school weeks.
